



Pupil Premium Report 2018 – 19

Over the past year we have used the Pupil Premium funding in a variety of ways to make sure that eligible children receive every opportunity to be successful. This includes greater levels of welfare care, enhanced in-class support and further interventions to support learning. The academy endeavours to get the best value for money from the funding they have received.

Planned spending and actions for 2018-19 academic year

The budget for 2018-19 showed that 27 children were likely to be in receipt of FSM giving a total PPG figure of £25,080. We reflected on our spending and were determined to continue to improve the outcomes for all disadvantaged children and the 2018 cohort. We reviewed the effectiveness of our spending during the summer term 2018.
